

Exodus 20:17

Focal Truth:

Do not desire what belongs to another.

1. The sinfulness of covetousness – desiring more than enough.

- a) The covetous <u>desire</u> more than they have been given. Eccl. 5:10,1:8
- b) The covetous <u>dream</u> of having what is their neighbors. Ps. 10:3, Pr. 24:2
- c) The covetous <u>devour</u> what is their neighbors.

 1 Kings 21:15-16
- d) The covetous <u>destroy</u> themselves. Pr. 11:3

- 3. The life of enough godly contentment Ps. 73:25
- a) When we desire God we will not covet. Ps. 16:5-6
- b) When we trust God we will not covet. Jer. 17:7
- c) When God's word is our guide we will not covet. Ps. 119:35,36
- d) When we are dead to sin we will not covet.– Col. 3:5
- e) When we learn to be content we will not covet. Phil. 4:11
